

FARC Celebrates Field Day with ARRL Contest Manager Bart Jahnke W9JJ By Joe Scheibinger



The single most popular event for Amateur Radio enthusiasts is coming up on June 24th and June 25th! And it's the biggest event all year for our FARC! What better person to have for our Field Day pep rally entertainment for June than the ARRL Contest Branch Manager himself! Bart Jahnke W9JJ will be our guest at our next FARC meeting on June 12th at Moraine Park College.

Former ARRL staffer Bart Jahnke, W9JJ, is the League's new ARRL Contest Branch manager. Jahnke returned to ARRL Headquarters on January 4 after a decade away, which he spent working in the customer service, manufacturing sales and support, and information technology fields in the Midwest and on the East Coast. He succeeds Matt Wilhelm, W1MSW, who resigned last year.

"It is great to be back at ARRL and to see the faces of many friends still here and still dedicated to serving Amateur Radio, as well as new faces, new friends, to join with in the journey," said Jahnke, who previously spent nearly 20 years at Headquarters. "Of the many bustling activity areas at ARRL Headquarters, the Contest Branch remains right up there in terms of high demand. With continued strong activity comes our obligation to produce and release results as rapidly as possible."

Jahnke said that as he gets up to speed in his new role, he hopes with the help of Headquarters staff and volunteer data processors and log checkers outside Headquarters, to make things happen more rapidly and efficiently, processing and publishing contest results without compromising the integrity of the current system.

"We need to continue to work smarter, not harder, to serve the contest community," he said.

Bart Jahnke W9JJ has a Wisconsin connection! He is originally from Wausau and grew up on a family farm in grid square EN55hb. He was licensed in Wausau in 1979 as KA9DLH, then upgraded his call to KB9NM. Bart holds an ASEE from North Central Technical College. In addition to his time with ARRL (nearly 22 years accumulated), he also worked in several fields (including Farm Fields : -) with companies like AAA (Greater Hartford), LifeQuest Services (Wautoma), Sunrise Medical (Stevens Point), Jade Jeans (LaSalle Rd West Hartford), and IT Services with Datamax (Northbrook IL). Bart has participated in many operating events during his 36 years, from weather spotting, to event communications, to VHF Mountain topping in the East, and even Multiop contesting with W2SZ and W0AIH, and even an operation from the Roof of 4U1UN in NYC.

Many may recall Jahnke from his former role as ARRL Volunteer Examiner Coordinator (VEC) Manager, a position in which he served from 1989 until 2005. Jahnke initially joined the ARRL Headquarters staff in 1985, starting out as editor of the ARRL Repeater Directory.



Jahnke said that, while his primary interest during his 36 years in ham radio has been with volunteer activities and "weak-signal" VHF, UHF, and microwave contesting, meteor scatter and EME work, he has also enjoyed casually operating in HF contests. He concedes, however, that it may be time to "add some forte to my low-bands!"

Gene's award was for developing a Logging Program that tracks over 35 MARAC awards. This was a replacement of the first Logging program developed by KJ4EJ – KwikLog).

The Mobile Amateur Radio Awards Club, Inc. was organized in 1970 as a non profit corporation. MARAC is a support group for county hunting and mobile activities with members all over the world. MARAC is staffed entirely by volunteers. MARAC is not affiliated with CQ Magazine. The purpose of of this site is provide information to membership and prospective members regarding the business and activities of MARAC.

The first achievement in county hunting is usually to work and confirm all United States counties, which number 3077 at this time, and submit an application to CQ Magazine for their USA-CA Award. There are many awards that MARAC offers that do not require a USA-CA award. Many of the more popular MARAC awards are working all counties a 2nd, 3rd or even a 12th time! Bingo and Master Gold are also very popular awards.

This group has had – some are Silent Keys — over 7000 members. 1259 amateur radio operators have worked all of the counties. One (KZ2P) has worked all 18 times, K9EAB was the first and did it from an Iron Lung. There are 18 that have transmitted from all 3077,



Growing the Ranks vs. Growing the Enjoyment By Dan Romanchik, KB6NU



Because I teach amateur radio classes and publish a series of popular amateur radio license study guides (www.kb6nu.com/study-guides/), I often get kudos for "growing the ranks." In fact, Gordon West, WB6NOA, told me this just last week, when he stopped by the booth I was in at the Dayton Hamvention. I'm paraphrasing a little, but after telling me that he's heard good things about my study guides, he said something like, "You're doing good work in helping get more people into ham radio."

People say that as if this is—or should be—the ultimate goal of teaching a license class. While this may be one of the goals, if that's your primary goal, I think that you're barking up the wrong tree.

In a way, creating more hams is selfish. If there are more licensed amateur radio operators, they say, then amateur radio will have more political clout with the FCC and with Congress, making it easier to pass legislation like the Amateur Radio Parity Act. While this may certainly help the new ham down the line, its main thrust is to reduce restrictions on those who are currently hams.

My goal in teaching amateur radio classes isn't to create more hams. Instead, my goal is to help more people have fun with ham radio. The first step in helping people have fun with ham radio is, of course, helping them get their license. I do that by publishing my study guides and teaching ham classes.

The next step, and I'm only really getting started on this right now, is to help people learn what they need to know to become better ham radio operators. That's why I got a little excited when I saw the article, "Making a Good hobby Better Through Post-Licensing Enrichment" by Tim Busch, N0CKR in the latest issue of Radio Waves, the ARRL's email newsletter for amateur radio instructors.

In the article, Tim describes several activities that his club encourages, including a "new ham net" and the Field Day GOTA station, but he also details a program of "mini classes" that will teach specific skills related to ham radio. These include:

- * Programming Radios and Getting on the Air
- * Soldering 101
- * Multimeter 101
- * Build and Use a Roll-Up J-Pole Antenna
- * Build and Use a Satellite Antenna
- * Foxhunts
- * Operating Digital Modes: IRLP, AllStar, D-Star, EchoLink, etc.
- * Remote Operation
- * Software-Defined Radios
- * Transitioning from VHF/UHF to HF Operating
- * Chasing Awards
- * Learn CW
- * Contesting

Tim writes, "Each class is intended to be no more than two hours at a sitting, so they can be held before a monthly club meeting. The variety of subject matter allows many club members to get involved in leading a topic. Materials kits are prepared in advance, so students walk away with practical items they can use at home."







