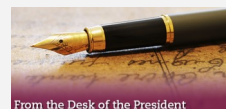

FARC Celebrates Field Day w/ ARRL Contest Mgr Bart Jahnke W9JJ AGAIN!

After last month's lack luster entertainment, studying the acoustics of the men's room at Moraine Park with about 40 people, we have great entertainment for the July meeting! Maybe I should explain!

At the June meeting we were met with a major storm. A lot of our Hams were out in the field weather spotting for the local agencies. The rest of us were bunkered down in the World Room waiting for the entertainment to begin. ARRL's Bart Jahnke was on the screen and we were ready to begin. Then the sirens sounded! Not knowing what to do at that point, Stan Cram mentioned we may want to seek shelter! It seems the storm shelter is in the men's room right next to the World room, so everyone huddled in there for a pre-meeting. The power didn't flicker but never the less we lost Internet function and couldn't continue with the Skype. We all commented that this is the first time in the history of the club that the meeting started in the men's room!

So Bart Jahnke graciously accepted our invitation again for the July meeting! This will be a post-Field Day event where we can celebrate together a VERY successful Field Day.



Former ARRL staffer Bart Jahnke, W9JJ, is the League's new ARRL Contest Branch manager. Jahnke returned to ARRL Headquarters on January 4 after a decade away, which he spent working in the customer service, manufacturing sales and support, and information technology fields in the Midwest and on the East Coast. He succeeds Matt Wilhelm, W1MSW, who resigned last year.

"It is great to be back at ARRL and to see the faces of many friends still here and still dedicated to serving Amateur Radio, as well as new faces, new friends, to join with in the journey," said Jahnke, who previously spent nearly 20 years at Headquarters. "Of the many bustling activity areas at ARRL Headquarters, the Contest Branch remains right up there in terms of high demand. With continued strong activity comes our obligation to produce and release results as rapidly as possible."

Jahnke said that as he gets up to speed in his new role, he hopes with the help of Headquarters staff and volunteer data processors and log checkers outside Headquarters, to make things happen more rapidly and efficiently, processing and publishing contest results without compromising the integrity of the current system. "We need to continue to work smarter, not harder, to serve the contest community," he said.

Bart Jahnke W9JJ has a Wisconsin connection! He is originally from Wausau and grew up on a family farm in grid square EN55hb. He was licensed in Wausau in 1979 as KA9DLH, then upgraded his call to KB9NM. Bart holds an ASEE from North Central Technical College. In addition to his time with ARRL (nearly 22 years accumulated), he also worked in several fields (including Farm Fields : -) with companies like AAA (Greater Hartford), LifeQuest Services (Wautoma), Sunrise Medical (Stevens Point), Jade Jeans (LaSalle Rd West Hartford), and IT Services with Datamax (Northbrook IL). Bart has participated in many operating events during his 36 years, from weather spotting, to event communications, to VHF Mountain topping in the East, and even Multiop contesting with W2SZ and W0AIH, and even an operation from the Roof of 4U1UN in NYC.

Many may recall Jahnke from his former role as ARRL Volunteer Examiner Coordinator (VEC) Manager, a position in which he served from 1989 until 2005. Jahnke initially joined the ARRL Headquarters staff in 1985, starting out as editor of the ARRL Repeater Directory. Jahnke said that, while his primary interest during his 36 years in ham radio has been with volunteer activities and "weak-signal" VHF, UHF, and microwave contesting, meteor scatter and EME work, he has also enjoyed casually operating in HF contests. He concedes, however, that it may be time to "add some forte to my low-bands!"

We all took the test together. The three of us walked out with a big smile, a fresh new license, and a new outlook on the sport of Amateur Communications. Jeff received the callsign N9OSB, I received the callsign N9OSA, and Randy received N9PGX. Randy and I subsequently changed our calls, Jeff kept his callsign.

About the time I joined the FARC, Jeff was already having health problems. I believe he did come to a couple of meetings, but because of his health he did not take an active role in the club, but he did enjoy getting the newsletters from me.

I personally respected and admired Jeff on a number of levels. Jeff was an incredible father to his kids. Jeff could fix anything, and his friends knew that! Jeff had his own repair shop in the back of his house with all the tools you need, and Randy helped Jeff on the larger repairs.

Jeff had a love for radio communications. I very seldom seen him without a 2 meter rig, or a scanner! Even in the last few years when visiting Jeff in the hospitals and rehabilitation centers, the conversation always centered on Ham Radio, the good times, and Ham Radio!

How to Copy CW in Your Head By Dan Romanchik, KB6NU



The second most common question that I get about CW is, “How do I learn to copy in my head?” When I get this question, I give, what to some, is a very unsatisfying answer. One day, I just went cold turkey. I put down the pencil and paper and never copied letter-by-letter ever again.

Carlo Consoli, IK0YGG, author of *Zen and the Art of Radiotelegraphy* (http://www.qsl.net/ik0ygg/enu/ZART_r20101008m.pdf), says that what operators need to do is to program themselves to copy in their heads. He counsels operators to practice relaxation and visualization exercises. Visualize yourself as a high-speed operator, and maybe one day you will be one.

This approach seems to have worked for Consoli. He is a member of the Very High Speed Club (VHSC), First Class Operator's Club (FOC), and has been clocked at copying over 70 wpm. I'm not sure that this is really going to work for everyone, though.

Another approach is touted by Carl, N7AGK. On his website, Carl writes, “I have created a program to assist you in learning to copy Morse code in your head. Everything you need will be contained on a single USB flashdrive that I will provide to you. In the program there are audio Morse code presentations followed by a visual display. The visual display shows the information in large print and upper case letters. The visual display verifies that you have received the Morse code correctly.” Carl's program costs \$20 and is available from n7agk.com.

Zeb, HB9FXW, has created a free web application called Seiuchy (<http://www.kb6nu.com/let-walrus-help-copy-head/>) to help people learn head copying. Seiuchy, which Zeb says is Japanese for walrus, simulates on-air contacts. The trick to using this app is that instead of copying exactly what's sent, you only copy the most important bit of information. The idea is that if you train yourself to do this, then you can concentrate on what's important rather than getting bogged down in copying what's not important.

A different take on head copy was sent in by one of my blog readers, Bill, W3MSH. He wrote, “I was a CW op for many years and discovered something fascinating. I first began to hear “dots and dashes”, then letters, words, sentences and at 35+ wpm, thoughts in my head.”

I think Bill may have hit the nail on the head with this comment. I like the idea that copying code in your head is more akin to generating thoughts than it is to copying individual characters or words. Everybody talks about how getting faster is about moving from copying individual characters to copying words to copying entire sentences. I've never thought of it that way, although I was at a loss as to how to describe how I do it. I think the idea that when copying in your head, the code creates thoughts directly is a beautiful way to put it.

Isn't that what's happening when you talk to someone? When someone talks to me, I don't consciously parse the sentences and then analyze them to see what was just said. It's more of an unconscious process. The sounds being uttered are creating ideas in my head.

Shouldn't we approach head copy in the same way? Instead of thinking about head copy as the process of writing down the characters on an internal blackboard to be read later, it should be about translating the sound of the Morse Code directly into concepts. The sounds “dah di dit...dah dah dah....dah dah dit,” should conjure up the image of a poodle or a pitbull, not the letters “D O G.”

How that translates into a program or a method for learning to copy the code in one's head is another matter. It might be worth thinking about, though.

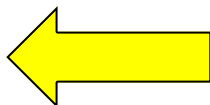

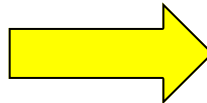
