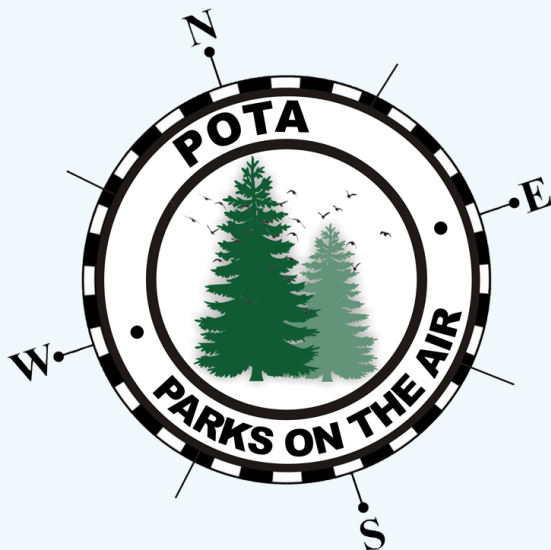

Parks on the Air ("POTA")

What it is:

In 2016, the ARRL sponsored "National Parks on the Air" (NPOTA) to celebrate the Nation Park Service 100th anniversary and to showcase portable amateur radio. After the NPOTA event was completed a group of hams developed POTA, which encourages ham to get outside and operate or "activate" certain designated Federal and State lands. Both the ham operating in the park (the activator) and the "hunter" who is attempting to make a qso can earn awards. The activator has to send his logs into POTA for the qso's to count toward awards. Awards are free and are sent to you via email. I encourage you to learn more by looking at the www.parksontheair.com site for more details.

2. My involvement:

I obtained my tech and general licenses in July of 2020 and my Extra license in November of 2020. I purchased my first HF rig in November and soon I heard the call of "CQ POTA CQ POTA". It did not take very long, before I was hooked on being a hunter. I soon learned that POTA encourages the use of not just sideband, but digital modes as well, and I was soon chasing the activators via FT8 and FT4.

I wanted to do more, though. I wanted to be an activator. I purchased a Wolf River Coil system (WRC) and worked with learning how to tune it and deploy it. After I felt comfortable with it, I looked around for a park to activate at. The obvious choice for me was Eldorado State Wildlife Area, just west of Fond du Lac. The western side is only about 20 minutes from my QTH of Ripon. I found several good parking areas, including one not marked on the map, but is by the actual road.

But, still I wanted to make it simpler. I purchased Diamond K-400 trunk mount so that I could mount the WRC on my SUV and use the SUV as a ground plan. I have installed the mount and by using the WRC with a whip antenna, I have received good DX with it.

3. My equipment:

Radios – Yaesu FT-818nd (6 watts) and a Xiegu G90 (20 watts) w/ cooling rack. I found that the G90 becomes very hot if you are activating, but with the cooling fan, it stays cool.

Antennas- Wolf River Coil SB 1000 with the large tripod and 8.5 foot whip. I can also deploy the WRC mounted on the back of my SUV. I also can use an Alex Loop, and a low power End Fed antenna. I hope to be able to set up the

back of my SUV. I also can use an Alex Loop, and a low power End Fed antenna. I hope to be able to set up the End Fed antenna soon and switch between the End Fed and WRC mounted on my SUV.

4. A few stories.

My high school aged special needs daughter will sometimes come with dad to do radio as she knows she can squeeze dad for a lemon aide. She will set in the front seat and play with a toy or two while I do radio. About 45 minutes in, she will start to ask how much longer. That gives me about 15 more minutes until I have to pack it up. Several days ago, when I was out at Eldorado State Wildlife Area, there was a large Ag sprayer tractor parked in the parking area I like to use. Pretty soon he shows up, unlocks a gate and he disappears down a road into a field. I did not see him again. Later on, another man shows up in a pickup truck and asks if I have dog, as I wanted to tell me that he was going to be target shooting in the parking area next door and did not want to frighten any dogs. This morning when I was out to Eldorado State Wildlife Area, I observed to groups of men dropping off their canoes to go out into the marsh and lake.

FCC NEWS

The \$35 FCC application fee for radio amateurs has been postponed until 2022 to give the FCC time to upgrade the FCC website.

All amateurs that are renewing the license or making an application to upgrade their license will be required by the FCC to provide them with a valid email address. The FCC will be contacting the amateurs via email from this point on.

New Applicants for Amateur Radio Licenses will be required to get a FRN from the FCC website before coming to an exam session. Social Security numbers aren't accepted on the FCC form 605 any longer and if you don't have a FRN you will be unable to take the Technician exam.



KC9YVL Portable Operations and Go Box

I would like to share a little about portable operations and the go box I created. I actually have two go boxes. An HF go box and VHF/UHF go box. The 2 meter/70cm one is built into a small case and used for my work as a volunteer for SATERN (Salvation Army Emergency Radio Network) group for more local communications.

The go box I used on 8/28/21 is my HF go kit. I qualified Lighthouse Island (WI073) in Lakeside Park for the U.S. Islands program QSO Party. I setup a station on the middle part of the island. The main components of my kit are a large cooler on wheels, a lawn mower size deep cycle battery, an Icom 7000 HF transceiver with IT-100 antenna tuner. The go kit has a trio of antennas which include an offset center fed dipole with a 25 foot extendable mast & tripod, an end fed wire antenna (easiest to deploy and a Wolf River coil ad-

justable vertical antenna setup. The HF go box is capable of working 10-80 meters contains some RG8X coax, a ground stake, folding table, a seat cushion to be able sit on the cooler, a 10 X 12 tarp, poles as well as stakes and ropes for the tarp. Also in the go box I carry some tools such as pliers, screwdriver, hammer and etc. I also carry miscellaneous supplies such as rope, zip ties, electrical tape, antenna adapters and a 20 Oz. soda bottle filled with sand with a string tied on for throwing a line over a limb in a tree. Everything in the go box fits in the cooler or on top of it. The Go box fits into a trunk, truck bed or a back seat.

An amateur can use a setup like this for many portable, off grid situations but not limited to emergency disaster communications, island activations, parks on the air or summits on the air events. Amateurs also do portable operations for fun!

Some tips I learned are to add "stroke portable" after your call sign when communicating. The amount of output power you use will be dependent on how big of a 12 volt battery you use. The output of your station could vary from .5 watts to 100 watts. Check the weather

forecast. Make sure the location is safe and it is legal to operate from. Search for a shady spot and make sure you ground your station. Make sure your battery is charged, bring paper and pencil for logging, bring a garbage bag or clear plastic cover to protect your equipment in case of a quick rain shower. If you setup in a public area mark all your wires, cables and ropes so nobody trips over them. Bring spare fuses, make a plan and write down an inventory list of items needed and then check them off as pack up. Test new equipment before you leave. Another thing I have learned is to double check to make sure you have everything and pack as light as you can. If you're hiking into an area have a shelter that stays put in the wind, bring along bug spray and dress for the weather. Provide shade or a sun visor for your transceiver display which are hard to see in bright sunlight. I'm sure there are some things I missed in this article so feel free to ask me questions. Go out and have some fun operating outdoors!

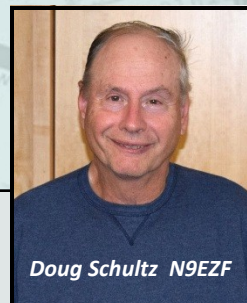

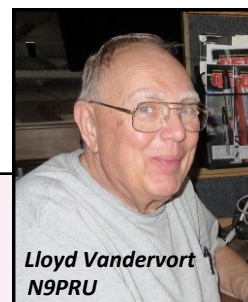
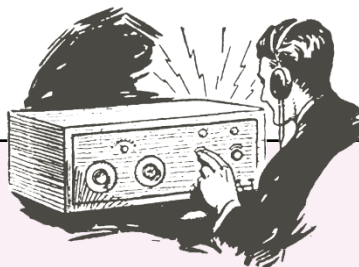

- 2) Add necessary text to qualify for IRS 501(c)(3) designation per IRS Publication 557.
- 3) Change outdated voting requirements that the organization was not aware of. Pursuant to the current Articles of Incorporation; only General Class or Higher Certificate holding members are allowed to vote on matters of business at any meeting of members. Once adopted, voting rules will revert back to the Bylaws which allow every member to vote.

RESTATED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION – NON-STOCK, NOT FOR PROFIT CORPORATION

The following Restated Articles of Incorporation of THE FOND DU LAC AMATEUR RADIO CLUB, INC duly adopted pursuant to the authority and provisions of Chapter 181 of the Wisconsin Statutes, supersede and take place of the existing Articles of Incorporation and any amendments thereto:

Article 1. The name of the corporation is: The Fond du Lac Amateur Radio Club, Inc.

Article 2. The corporation is organized under Ch. 181 of the Wisconsin Statutes.

Article 3. The name of the Registered Agent is: Douglas Schultz

Article 4. The address of the registered office is:
541 Delaware Ave; North Fond du Lac, WI. 54936

Article 5. The principal office address of the Corporation is:
PO Box 53; Fond du Lac, WI. 54936

Article 6. The corporation shall have members.

Article 7. The corporation is authorized to make distributions under sec. 181.1302(4).

Article 8. The purpose for which the corporation is organized is to promote the interest of amateur radio in the general community, develop individual efficiency by furthering cooperation among its members and to offer our service to the community in times of emergency or disaster.

Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

Article 8.1. No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, trustees, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article 8 hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or interfere in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax

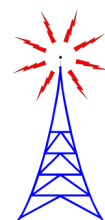
