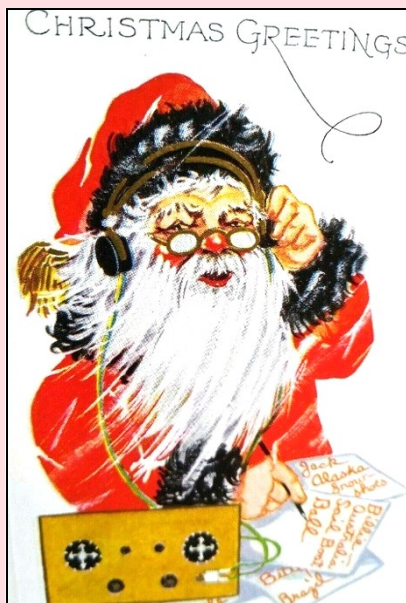

Member Highlight Series

Bob Burrier N2TSQ

Each month we will highlight and interview a club member and go into a little about the amateur activities as well as their interests. This month's member highlight features Bob Burrier and his call is KN2TSQ.

I met Bob Burrier N2TSQ about 4 years ago at ARRL Field Day held by the Fond du Lac club at the UW-Fond du Lac campus parking lot. At the time he had just moved to his Lake Winnebago home for the weekend.

Bob got into amateur radio because his dad was a Ham, and because of that his interest developed in the hobby. He became licensed in 1993 as a Technician in central New Jersey and then upgraded to General license class. That is the reason for his N2 call sign. Bob has a Ph.D. in Medicinal Biochemistry from Boston University and has worked in academics as well as for a number of large pharmaceutical and biotech companies. He has run a number of businesses and operated R&D facilities around the world including China, India, Scotland and Germany. Bob, along with his wife and son, moved up and down the east coast of the U.S. for his work, then located to Madison about 13 years ago. Over the past 4 years has come to enjoy Fond du Lac and was interested in downsizing in preparation for retirement. Since the weekend home wouldn't suit the needs of being a full-time FDL resident he and his wife tore down the old house during the pandemic and built a new one on the property and moved in last February. Bob mentioned how ham radio has been a great diversion from anything related to work over the years and how he has met so many nice hams wherever he has lived.

Bob has his primary ham shack in his woodworking shop. This well planned shack includes equipment such as a Yaesu FTDX-3000 radio and a ACOM 1010 amplifier for HF, and a Kenwood TM-V71 dual band VHF/UHF radio. He has his dual band antenna in the attic for 2 meters/70cm. His HF antennas consist of an offset center fed dipole and a Telex Hy-Gain DX-88 vertical with a dozen radials that he bought used from another ham 30 years ago. He also has another HF transceiver, an Icom 7300, in his living room in a maple box he built complete with a power supply, antenna tuner and SignaLink. This has become the FT8 location he uses most often which is connected to the vertical antenna. He can look out his living room at Lake Winnebago and simultaneously work FT8 from his easy chair. He is quite active on the Hf bands since he has nearly 14, 500 QSO's accumulated in his log with over half of them being FT8 QSO's. He operates SSB as well as CW on the Yaesu FTDX-3000. He often uses the CW decoder feature to help him with the CW QSO's running at a very high speed. Interestingly, Bob's entire radio operations are supported by his Macintosh computer and he would be very interested in speaking to others with a similar setup.

Bob mentioned that his dipole took a direct hit of lightning from a storm while living in the old house during the summer of 2019. In addition to vaporizing a good portion of the antenna and exploding the balun, the energy also got into the house where it blew a hole in the water pipe where the household ground was connected. In addition, it destroyed all the cable TV equipment and an ICOM 706. All this occurred with his antenna disconnected from the radio and grounded through a lightning arrester to its own ground rod!

Bob has been an active member of many clubs over the years, enjoys the casual hunt for DX, and has earned enough credits for both DXCC and WAS on many bands. He would like to encourage our club members that operate HF to announce DX spots on the local repeater. He says the comradery of sharing the hunt with other members is fun and encourages others to become more active as well. Bob has also suggested the idea of virtual ham shack tours via Zoom as program topics at our meetings.

(Have you ever heard of “Traffic handlers”)



When you think of Sport Aviation you immediately think of Oshkosh, the home of the Experimental Aircraft Association & Paul Poberezny, the father of Sport Aviation. But the spirit of the homebuilt movement has lived way before the first Oshkosh EAA convention in 1969. EAA got it's start in Hales Corners Wisconsin in 1953 under the direction of it's founder Paul and Audrey Poberezny. And ever since it's first convention in Rockford, Ham Radio has been a part of this great event.

My business partner Janice Marie and I have had the pleasure of being the house band for the all new Heidel House in Green Lake. There I met another very talented musician and Ham Radio enthusiast that you all may know who also plays an amazing clarinet by the name of Dick Regent K9GDF. Dick sat in with us one evening and we got to talking about Ham Radio. He mentioned that he was sending me some pictures of the ole days of providing “Traffic Handling” at the EAA event back in 1962. As someone who has been to every day of every single Oshkosh AA convention, you can imagine my feelings when I opened the Email to find incredible pictures like this!

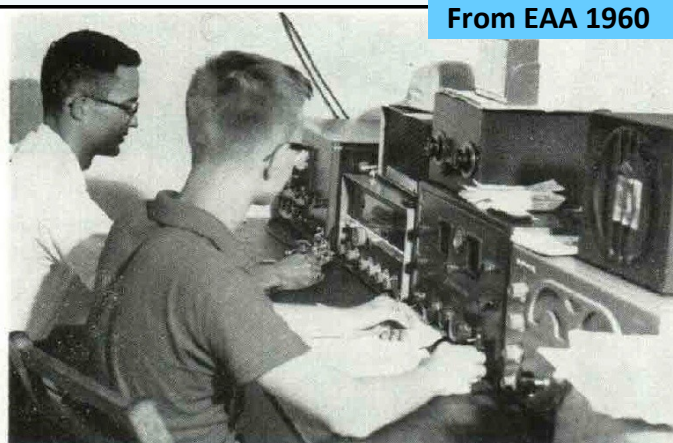
So I went back to the EAA magazine from 1962 and I found the article of Dick and the gang providing “Traffic” during the convention! The Wisconsin National Guard borrowed them a 2 1/2 ton vehicle for the week of the convention and Dick and the gang outfitted it with radios and antennas. From there the gang worked the bands, sending messages to people from the convention all over the world.

They would send about 40 messages per day and keep in touch with fellow Ham EAA members throughout the country.

Ham radio stations have had a very long history with EAA. There has been an operating traffic station at every EAA here in Oshkosh and also the Sun & Fun convention in Florida. The local convention shack is always populated with hams from all over the world shaking hands and meeting their fellow hobbyists from all over the world.

"Traffic Handlers" have not gone away with modern technology! In fact Traffic Handling is alive and well and still supported by the ARRL. More information on this will be in future newsletters.

When these pictures were taken, there was no Internet, no Emails, long distance telephone calls were charged by the call and were very expensive depending on the time of day!

Dick Regent was the station manager in charge of Ham Radio for Wisconsin. His love of the hobby was evident when watching the excitement on his face as he recalled these incredible moments in time from 60 years ago! It was an incredible evening visiting with this man who loves his hobby.

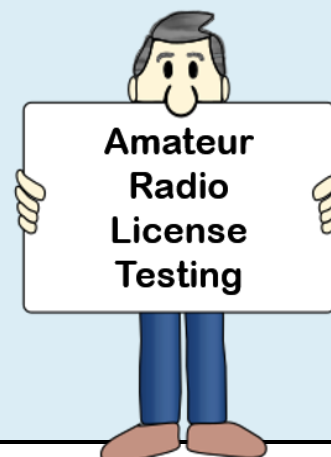
Next Amateur License Exam Scheduled for December 4th, 2021

The Fond du Lac Amateur Radio Club VE team will be holding an exam sessions at MPTC this Winter. It is scheduled for December 4, 2021 from 900 AM until noon in room O-103 at MPTC. Face coverings will be required at the exam session. If you need more information on the exam sessions please contact Doug Schultz at 920-922-3088 or via email at: schultz74@charter.net.

The \$35 FCC application fee for radio amateurs has been postponed until 2022 to give the FCC time to upgrade the FCC website.

All amateurs that are renewing the license or making an application to upgrade their license will be required by the FCC to provide them with a valid email address. The FCC will be contacting the amateurs via email from this point on.

New Applicants for Amateur Radio Licenses will be required to get a FRN from the FCC website before coming to an exam session. Social Security numbers aren't accepted on the FCC form 605 any longer and if you don't have a FRN you will be unable to take the Technician exam.
