FARC FIELD DAY

Right now, members of the FARC are preparing for their biggest day of the year, Field Day, under the direction of Dr. Jack Heil KG9IN. We will be discussing this more at the meeting, and finalizing the event at the Rag Chews and Brews Board Meeting on May 23rd. Here is what we have accomplished so far.

The location has been confirmed as the University parking lot, the same location as in previous years. Invitations have been sent to 11 government dignitaries, 3 TV stations, 1 radio station, and we have an interview pending set up with KFIZ just before the event. We will discuss more at the meeting.



The Fond du Lac Amateur Radio Club VE's have scheduled two more exam sessions for October 15, 2022 and December 10, 2022 in room O-122 at MPTC. Everyone taking amateur exams is required to get a FRN from the FCC website to put on their FCC application as well as provide a photo ID. I have a suggestion for people taking the Technician exam to also study for the General exam since if you pass the Tech. exam on the first try you can take the General exam for free. Cost of the exam is \$15. Preregistering is encouraged, but walk-ins are allowed at the exams. To pre-register for any of the exam sessions call Doug Schultz at 920-922-3088 or via email at: schultz74@charter.net.

The FCC has announced that effective on April 19, 2022 they will begin assessing the \$35 application fee on new, renewals and vanity callsign applications. Upgrades to amateur licenses will be exempt from the \$35 application fee according to the ARRL-VEC. Administrative updates, such as name changes, mailing or email address changes will be exempt from the fee.

VE's and VE teams will not have to collect the \$35 application fees at exam sessions. They will charge the normal \$15 ARRL-VEC exam fee to applicants. The successful applicants will be required to pay the \$35 application fee directly to the FCC by using the CORES FRN registration system. When the FCC receives the examination from the ARRL-VEC, it will email a link with payment instructions to each successful candidate who will have 10 calendar days from the date of the email to pay the application fee. After the fee is paid the examinees will receive a second email from the FCC with a link to their official license. The link will good for 30 days. Additionally, the FCC stated that applications processed and dismissed will not be entitled to a refund. This includes vanity requests where the applicant does not receive the requested callsign.

MEMBER HIGHLIGHT BILL KIECKBUSCH KG9IO

Bill retired from ATT in 2019 after 24 years of being an Outside Technician. Now he works part time at Fleet Farm in the sporting goods department. His part time job fits him well since he likes to fish in his spare time.

Bill started out in CB, and was invited over to Dave McCumber N9WQ's shack on Military Avenue in Fond du Lac to see his radio collections. Bill decided then and there to get licensed and took his Technician license exam at Community United Methodist Church in North Fond du Lac. Doug Schultz N9EZF was one of the VE's at the exam session.

Bill began working on his code speed to pass the 5 word per minute code exam and got his Technician license later in 1993. Bill continued working on increasing his code speed to pass the 13 word per minute code exam which was required along with the 35 question written portion to get the General license. Bill took the General license exam and passed both the written exam and the 13 wpm code exam at Red Granite, WI in 1994.

Bill made his first CW contact with a Swan 350C. He then studied for the Advanced license and took it an passed the Advanced license exam at Community United Methodist Church in North Fond du Lac later in 1994.

Bill's current ham shack has Icom Ic-7410 HF/6 meter Transceiver, Icom IC-745 HF transceiver and Yaesu Ft-101ZD HF transceiver. Bill also has Icom IC-706 MkIIG that he uses on the VHF/UHF bands with an ED Fong j-pole antenna. He uses the following antennas: Hustler 5 BTV vertical with 17 meters and 12 meters capabilities. He also uses a offset center fed dipole for 80-10 meters. Bill is also in the process of refurbishing a hexbeam that was damaged in a windstorm last fall and wants to get back up on a tower this year. If he can't get it on a 40 foot tower this year he will put it on a tripod on his house roof.

Bill is primarily a SSB operator today but he would like to get more involved in getting back on CW.

The Wisconsin QSO Party is sponsored by the West Allis Radio Amateur Club and it was held on March 13, 2022 from 1800 UTC until 0100 UTC on March 14, 2022. They are still in the log submission phase. The deadline is 3/27 and they need to

allow time for any paper logs mailed and postmarked by 3/27. Paper logs then need to be entered into the database tool. Each log goes through a quality check and is re-scored (logging program scoring is usually incorrect). Once they have insured good data quality, their automated system can quickly score and tabulate results. Expect publication by June 1st, and as soon as they are published they will be listed in our newsletter.

CLUB MINUTES FOR APRIL

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 Pm by President Dave McCumber N9WQ presiding. We had a Skype program with George Ulm and his wife Susan at this ham shack and Radio Museum on Washington Island. In the early 1960's George purchased an apple and cherry farm on Washington Island, WI. At retirement he decided to raise amateur antenna on the property instead of fruit. He lives there year around with his wife Susan. He has a massive museum of almost every ham radio ever made. George and Susan rent out cottages on the property and amateurs can make reservations to rent out the cottages.

President Dave McCumber then had everyone introduce themselves since we had a number of new members attending the meeting. Ron Keller KC9YVL then reported they he had purchased a trailer for the club which is several years old and in good condition. It is 6 ½ ft by 12 foot and the cost was \$2250. On Sunday, April 24 we will move our equipment out of the storage locker and determine we the club wants to sell prior to May club swapfest.

Doug Schultz N9EZF reported on the results of the April 9,2022 exam session. We had 7 candidates that took exams and six candidates that passed exams. Six passed the Tech. exam and two of those passed the General license exam. The next exam session for our club VE's will be on October 15, 2022 at MPTC in Room O-122.

Doug Schultz reported that the IRS had rejected our 501C3 application and we think it had an incorrect Tax ID on it.

Next month's meeting will have a swap meet so everyone needs to bring excess from their shack to the meeting.

Field Day is going to be held on June 25 and 26. Initial plans are to hold it at the UW-Fond du Lac north parking lot. Cully Kowal KS0D suggested we should hold our Field Day at a more public location. This was turned down because of traffic and poor radio reception in the past with more public locations. It is also easier to secure the club's equipment at the campus.

Joe Scheibinger K9VY announced that the Board meeting will be held the third Monday of May at the Radisson. President Dave McCumber N9WQ made a motion to approve last month's meeting minutes that were published on the club newsletter. Cully Kowal KS0D. Dave then asked if there were any corrections or objections to the motion. None were raised and the motion passes.

Doug Schultz N9EZF then gave the Treasurer's report. A motion was made to approve the Treasurer's report by Tom Powell KC9VXR and seconded by Paul Tvrdy N9KLK. No objections were raised and motion passed. A motion was made to pay the bills by Dave McCunber N9WQ and seconded by Lloyd Vandervort N9RPU. No objections were raised to the motion to pay the bills and the motion passed.
