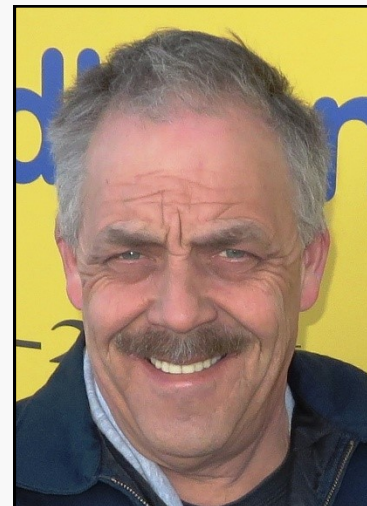

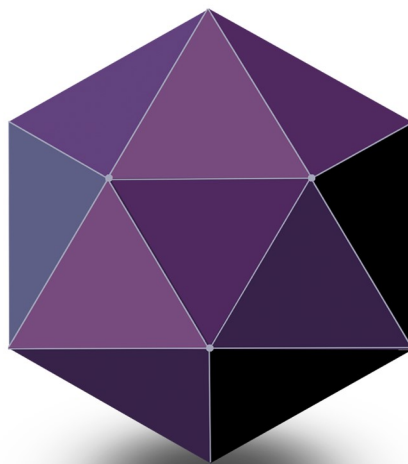

MEMBER HIGHLIGHT

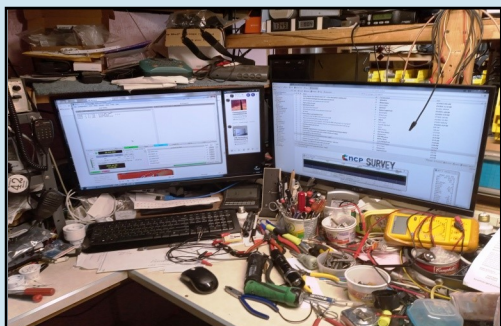
LLOYD VANDERVORT

N9PRU

Lloyd has been interested in amateur radio ever since high school, and received his Novice class license back in 1956. Lloyd then upgraded to Technician class in 1960 with the callsign K9HCO. He enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1963 and studied as an electronics technician. While in the U.S. Army he travelled throughout the Far East from 1963 through 1967. He travelled to: Hawaii, Japan, Okinawa, South Korea, Vietnam, Thailand and the Philippines during his Army career. His primary duties were repairing R390A receivers which used extensively in U.S. military installations world-wide. Lloyd was unable to renew his amateur license while in the military and it expired in 1966. He was stationed in Hawaii when his license was going to expire. But when he went to the FCC office to renew it the office closed for the day.

After his military service was complete in 1967 he worked in the TV business for over 45 years. Lloyd developed an interest in working satellites and he took the Technician license exam at Grays Lake, Illinois Swapfest in 1999. He and Tom Gabel N9RPQ both got their Technician licenses at the Grays Lake Swapfest. In May, 2003, Lloyd upgraded to the General class license at an exam session at Community United Methodist Church in North Fond du Lac. Lloyd also passed the 5 wpm code exam at that session in order to get the General class license and I was one of the VE's at that session.

Lloyd's favorite modes are the digital modes. He started out in PSK31 when it was popular on the HF bands and has transitioned to FT8/FT4 as those modes have become very popular on the HF bands today. Lloyd has a Yaesu FT-847 that uses on the HF band, Kenwood TS-790 for 2 meter & 70 cm. bands and Kenwood Triband base transceiver that covers 220 MHz. His antennas are: an Alpha Delta DX LB dipole for 80 meter thru 10 meter HF bands, a 6 meter moxon antenna, a 2 meter 13 element cross polarized yagi for satellite work, a 70 cm. 13 element cross polarized yagi for satellite work and 2 meter four pole vertical for repeater work.

Lloyd continues to repair all kinds of electronic equipment in his basement shop. Lloyd was instrumental in getting me more active in the hobby in 2019 at Field Day when he and Don KC9KZQ operated FT8 digital mode. Lloyd was a great mentor to me be able to get me on the air in FT8 before Field Day in 2020. He answered a bunch of questions that I had about getting the FT8 mode to work with my HF transceiver and laptop. It has developed into one of my favorite modes on the HF bands. Lloyd has been the Secretary for the Fond du Lac Amateur for a number of years as well. *Doug Schultz*

When I think of Lloyd Vandervort, I think "Shock and Awe." Remember that old term from a ways back? The shock is going down in that basement workshop and seeing a virtual candy store of exotic electronics and ham radio gear! I had to perform the next night and Lloyd had it repaired without a schematic! Then my PA system went on the blink. Within 24 hours that PA was working like new. 2 weeks ago the sound went out in one of my aviation headsets. Lloyd actually had the part available used and had the headset repaired within the hour.

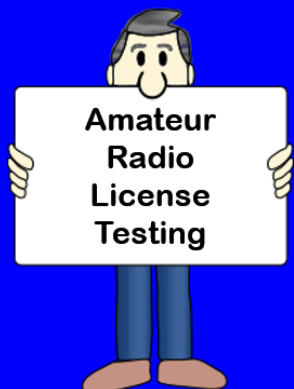
And then there is Lloyd's garage! This is a place you have to see! Lloyd actually found an electric riding mower and did a restoration on it. I didn't even know these things existed. A friend of his brought in an antique stereo and he proudly lifted the cover to show me the contents inside. That massive tube amplifier was replaced with a solid state amp the size of a pillbox! Cost of the exam is \$15. Preregistering is encouraged, but walk-ins are allowed at the exams. WITH RACE THE LAKE BIKE RACE

It's that time of year again! Fond du Lac County ARES needs Technician or higher licensed amateurs to assist with race communications throughout Race the Lake Bike Race course in Fond du Lac County on Sunday, August 21, 2022. Since we will be using the Appleton 146.76 repeater as the primary frequency you should be able to use an HT for this race with a gain antenna depending on actual location to get into Net Control at Lakeside Park. If you have a mobile VHF rig in your vehicle you should have no problems getting into Net Control. This is part of the Public Service aspect of Amateur Radio licenses. If you can help at Race the Lake Bike Race contact Doug Schultz at email: schultz74@charter.net or by phone at: 920-922-3088. there will be more at the July meeting.

Race the Lake is in its 14th year and an 89 mile race/ride around the majestic Lake Winnebago, full of scenic diversity and is enjoyed by all abilities from professional to the beginning cyclists.

The course will stage the dramatic start at Lakeside Park in Fond du Lac. The journey begins by heading north hugging the west side of Lake Winnebago and traveling through Oshkosh, Neenah, Menasha, Appleton and to the half way point at High Cliff State Park. Riders then take the east shoreline of Lake Winnebago - taking in lots of greenery, the mammoth blue lake and fresh country air. The course goes through Calumetville, Marytown, and St. Peter, and finishes at Lakeside Park (158 E. Harbor Drive) in Fond du Lac.

The FCC has announced that effective on April 19, 2022 they will begin assessing the \$35 application fee on new, renewals and vanity callsign applications. Upgrades to amateur licenses will be exempt from the \$35 application fee according to the ARRL-VEC. Administrative updates, such as name changes, mailing or email address changes will be exempt from the fee. VE's and VE teams will not have to collect the \$35 application fees at exam sessions. They will charge the normal \$15 ARRL-VEC exam fee to applicants. The successful applicants will be required to pay the \$35 application fee directly to the FCC by using the CORES FRN registration system.

When the FCC receives the examination from the ARRL-VEC, it will email a link with payment instructions to each successful candidate who will have 10 calendar days from the date of the email to pay the application fee. After the fee is paid the examinees will receive a second email from the FCC with a link to their official license. The link will good for 30 days. Additionally, the FCC stated that applications processed and dismissed will not be entitled to a refund. This includes vanity requests where the applicant does not receive the requested callsign.

The course will run for six weeks, five days a week, from 9 a.m. to noon. Code and theory will be taught by Gerald Bosso (W9JIF), a teacher at Oshkosh and amateur radio operator of 17 years experience.

Registrations will be accepted the week of June 9 in Room 101 of the institute on Algoma Boulevard and on the first morning of the course, June 16. Those who complete the course will be prepared for the advance class license test.
