

MEMBER HIGHLIGHT DOUG IVERSON AC9XW

Doug became interested in radio in high school when he had friends that were involved in Broadcast Band DXing. They were involved in Michigan Area Radio Enthusiasts club which still exists today. His first shortwave receiver in the late 1970's was a Realistic DX-160, then he progressed to a Sony 2010 and then he progressed to Lowe HF-150. His interest in Amateur Radio began to peak after he bought a SDR Play receiver and his stepfather who is a ham encouraged him to take the Technician exam. This was just prior to the start of the Covid pandemic in 2020. Doug took his Technician exam at the MPTC's parking lot in June of 2020. Our VE team gave car exams in the school's parking lot. Doug passed the Tech. and General exams at the test session. He had used the Ham Study app to study for his exams. He took the Extra exam on Thanksgiving weekend at HRO and passed it got his current callsign AC9XW.

His first HF transceiver was a Xeigu G-90 which he still uses for Parks on the Air activations. In January, 2021 he bought a Yaesu FTDX-3000 for a base HF radio and he uses a MFJ End Fed Half wave wire antenna for his home station. He has acquired a Cushcraft R7 vertical from his stepfather that he wants to mount about 10 feet above the ground before winter in his back yard. After he got his amateur license he primarily operated SSB phone.



He kept seeing a strong FT8 signal from KA9JDE who lives north of Ripon on his SDR radio and one day he found Brad's phone number. Doug called Brad and they started discussing the digital modes and operating. They have been friends ever since. Doug decided to try the FT8 digital mode and has been doing it a lot since. He started in Parks on the Air as a Hunter using the SSB mode in 2021 with the Xeigu G-90. He decided in August, 2021 to be a Parks on the Air activator. He has activated 14 parks in the POTA program. He is on his second 1000 POTA Qso's at the Eldorado Marsh which close to Ripon. He now activates Parks On The Air primarily on FT8 using his Xeigu G-90 running 17 watts feeding a Wolf River Coil antenna which is mounted on a Diamond K400 mount on his SUV. He uses a Raspberry running Linux to run the WSJT-X FT8 program along with the Flrig. He then extracts his adi.file to a Amazon Fire tablet in his SUV. He has several Lithium Phosphate long life batteries to power his equipment in the SUV.

Doug Iverson has gotten involved with Yaesu Fusion and has a Yaesu FT-2DR HT that he uses on the Thursday night Fusion net on the Rock River Radio Clubs Knowles 70 cm. repeater. He has the camera for the FT-2DR and has sent photos via Fusion as well. He has an older Yaesu FT-7900R transceiver for a base station and he uses a Tram 1480 dual band vertical for VHF/UHF nets.

Doug is also on the Ripon City Council as an elected Council Rep. He also serves on the Ripon Library Board as well as the Fire District Board.

He really likes DX and POTA in Amateur Radio. Doug in the future would like to try some new antennas in his POTA activations and he has an interest in trying satellite communications.

FT-8 MANIA INCREDIBLE FUN WITH HAM RADIO By Joe Scheibinger K9VY

Doug & Lloyd, what have you done to us! Ever since we had the two of you give a great presentation to the club, I have had this burning desire to try out the new FT-8 style of communication. So I waited for my life to slow down a little to the point I can take some time and let my curiosity take command. So a few weeks ago I downloaded some FREE software off the web and just as I thought, the bug bit hard and I found myself greatly enjoying an all new segment of a hobby I already love.

I can't comment much on this yet because there seems to be a steep learning curve. Set up took a few hours, and many calls to Lloyd Vandervort who graciously took the time to help a novice through the software jungle. But in one afternoon, I logged Cuba, Japan, South America, and 10 other countries I would have never been able to contact on low power and a small antenna. And just as free beer always tastes better for some reason, I spent nothing to get on board this new mode and broadcast around half a world in one afternoon.

So I'm sitting here trying to find out why this mode of operation seems to release so much dopamine to the brain! It's nothing like DX voice contact, or frankly any other mode I have tried. I find myself attracted again to my Kenwood and my basement man cave like never before! And even with FT-8 in its infancy with a lot of growing room, the mode seems to be catching fire around the world. I am even receiving stations in Australia with a very minimum amount of skip.

So here is what I have gathered in my first 2 weeks of FT-8. The mode crosses all language barriers. People from other non-English speaking countries can communicate with EVERYONE! You can SEE your signal! That's right. When you receive a signal from the station you contacted, the software actually shows an animated line on a global map that depicts a picture of your signal! You can tell your signal strength from the receiver you are sending your signal to! The contact is automatically logged. In the first night I logged 56 stations! Seeing there is no audio, I can listen to some music in the man cave! Software is set up for contesting. With QRZ, the contact bio is put up on the screen with the location instantly so you know who you contacted you! This in itself is amazing. And all of this is done without switching programs or endless typing.

And all of this fun is very affordable. In fact, if you already have a rig and computer, it costs you NOTHING! And for someone like me who has laryngitis most of the time, this is a perfect mode. So much fun for so little. Once again, thanks to Lloyd and Doug for showing the way.


Hi All,

Here is a list of materials that I came up with for building the trailer out. I even threw in a 150W solar panel and a 12v 30A battery and still just barely hit the \$1,000 mark that we were looking at possibly getting donated from Menards. Prices will vary and this price includes the 11% off so we will have to see how that plays out if we are paying for it using donations, but we can always buy the battery separately or maybe switch out to a smaller one. I did spec out some spare materials in case my estimates are off or if there are any mistakes while cutting. There are a few other small parts like cable feed-throughs and such but that should be less than \$100.



A brief description of what I am proposing here:

Along the long wall of the trailer, build 10 feet of shelving that will be 18" deep and either 30" or 25" between verticals which would allow space for a mix of large and smaller bins. Each shelf will have a piece of elastic and a hook for securing the bins to the shelves. In front of the shelving will be a small amount of space for storing the 10x10 tents as well as the mast section kits, this will also have an elastic strap for securing it against the wall and end of the shelves. On the opposite side of the trailer next to the door would be a fold-up workspace that will be attached to the wall by a hinge and a set of chains so that the space can be cleared up for loading/unloading. In the front of the trailer will be a portable air conditioner unit which is the item standing in the front center of the trailer, right behind that is where the club's 2 generators would be stored and would be wheeled out when they are needed. *Justin Buell kb9yet@yahoo.com*

Meeting Minutes





CLUB MINUTES FOR AUG 2022

The meeting began at 7:05 PM with John Portone W6NBC conducting a Zoom meeting about shortened attic dipole antennas. John describes a simple and cheap way to build an attic shortened dipole antenna. He makes his loading coils on a large cardboard tube using copper or aluminum tape. He describe the process of winding the foil tape evenly on the cardboard form. His 40 meter shortened dipole has two 10.5 ft end wires with a 4 foot loading coil in the middle. The loading coil uses a cardboard tube normally used for cement bases for antennas and it has 23 turns of 1/2inch foil tape that is fed with a smaller copper loop inside the load coil. His shortened dipole antennas allow ham operators to get on the air in HOA situations.

The business meeting was called to order with President Dave McCumber N9WQ at 7:45 PM. An introduction of attendees at the meeting followed.

A motion was made by Joe Lauber KC9MDY to approve last months meeting minutes as published in the newsletter. The motion was seconded by Tom Powell KC9VXR. The motion passed and the minutes were approved.

Doug Schultz N9EZF gave the Treasurer's report. A motion was made by Lloyd Vandervort N9RPU to approve the Treasurer's report and to pay the bills. Justin Buell KB9YET seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Doug Schultz N9EZF mentioned that the VE's will be holding exam sessions at MPTC On Oct. 15, 2022 and Dec. 10, 2022. If you can't make those sessions there are online exams readily available.

New members were brought up with latest new member being Patrick Knowles K9ZPU.

Dave McCumber N9WQ then asked about the 501C3 application status. Nothing to report.

Joe Scheibinger K9VY has submitted an application into the ARRL Foundation for a grant for \$20,000 and also a application to Menards for \$1,000 to fix the trailer for operating and storage.

Dave McCumber N9WQ and Justin Buell KB9YET were discussing the possibility of getting a smaller trailer to store the clubs excess junk if we were to fix up our trailer as operating station.

Dave McCumber N9WQ said storing at his shop isn't a problem as the truck was there for 15 years for free. He was disappointed that we sold the truck.



The FCC has announced that effective on April 19, 2022 they will begin assessing the \$35 application fee on new, renewals and vanity callsign applications. Upgrades to amateur licenses will be exempt from the \$35 application fee according to the ARRL-VEC. Administrative updates, such as name changes, mailing or email address changes will be exempt from the fee. VE's and VE teams will not have to collect the \$35 application fees at exam sessions. They will charge the normal \$15 ARRL-VEC exam fee to applicants. The successful applicants will be required to pay the \$35 application fee directly to the FCC by using the CORES FRN registration system.

When the FCC receives the examination from the ARRL-VEC, it will email a link with

payment instructions to each successful candidate who will have 10 calendar days from the date of the email to pay the application fee. After the fee is paid the examinees will receive a second email from the FCC with a link to their official license. The link will good for 30 days. Additionally, the FCC stated that applications processed and dismissed will not be entitled to a refund. This includes vanity requests where the applicant does not receive the requested callsign.


