

STEVE SMITH W9GPI

The Catastrophe in Fort Myers Florida



How do you even start an article like this? How do you adequately put into words the horrible devastation we have seen in the last week for a large section of Florida? We watch the news and see videos of entire cities blown down to the ground, bridges out, and some places of Florida are not expecting electricity for more than a month. National Guard units are handing out MRE's, water and ice, and other commodities to thousands who wait in line for help. So far as of this writing the liability to insurance companies is over 57 billion, and as far as the Federal Government, over 100 billion dollars. My business partner Janice suffered an incredible loss, more about that later.

Our former member Steve Smith is right in the middle of this. W9GPI moved from Wisconsin to Florida and now is part of the emergency team as a member of the Fort Myers Amateur Radio Club. When I called Steve, he was on the roof of a 12 story building inspecting the damage done to an antenna. As happy as it was to find out Steve is safe, you could hear sorrow in Steve's voice when he started talking about the devastation that happened to his community.

As Amateur Radio enthusiasts we have an unwritten responsibility to help in community emergencies and our Fond du Lac club has been there on the front lines many times. But even with our tornados and other bad weather experiences, we have never seen anything on a scale like this.

We are going to get Steve's perspective on this tragedy when he Skype's with us for the October meeting. Steve will talk about this devastation, and we can get a better insight into ham radio emergency situations from a man who is right in the middle of Florida's worst natural disaster.

And this is where it hits home. My business partner and very best friend Janice Marie will also be attending the October meeting. Janice is one of the finest recording artists in Wisconsin and we have been partners for about 18 years. Janice purchased the home of her dreams in Fort Myers just walking distance from the bridge that connected Sanibel Island to the mainland. She lost her condo and her vehicle just 5 days before she was to move there for October and November. Janice and I were going to perform there in early 2023.




Here are some pictures of Janice's home in Florida posted here with her permission. Last week we were entertaining in Milwaukee when she got the call that her condo was under water. The picture on the left is taken from the SECOND floor. Her condo is somewhere beneath it. The sea level is 8 feet high where her residents is located and the storm surge was 18ft. The picture on the right is of the mobile home park located right across the street. The third picture is Janice's car on top of the neighbors. The storm surge happened in a matter of seconds and you can see the power of the surge as it lifted up her car and placed it on another. One of her neighbors was washed away and clung to a tree saving his life. One neighbor was in his lower condo and the surge was so fast he didn't make it out.

The point of this is we need to learn more from Steve & Janice about what is needed when it comes to what kind of emergency help our club can provide in a case like this. How do you prepare yourself for the sudden lack of electricity that could go on for months? We need to know what kind of emergency services the Fort Myers Amateur Radio Club provided to their community. These disasters happen, and although we may never see one here that even comes close to what happened in Florida, our club need to be ready for anything the community requires.

MEMBER HIGHLIGHT

JOE LAUBER

KC9MDY

Joe Lauber had an interest in amateur radio in the 1970's but was turned off when he found out you had to copy Morse code in order to qualify for an amateur radio license. Joe spent 25 years in law enforcement so he was used to using radios at work everyday. He put his quest off for an amateur radio license until 2007 when he learned that the FCC had eliminated the Morse code requirement for all license classes. Joe came to a Fond du Lac Amateur Radio Club meeting in September, 2007 and then he took the Technician class exam in the fall of 2007 and got his amateur Tech license along with his callsign of KC9MDY. Joe then upgraded to the General class license in March, 2008 because he wanted to get on the HF bands.

Joe has a Yaesu FT-60R dual band hand held along with a Yaesu Ft-7800R dual band base radio in his shack. He has a Diamond dual band VHF/UHF antenna mounted on his roof for a base station antenna. For HF bands Joe has Yaesu FT-450 HF transceiver that is connected to a G5RV Junior antenna. The G5RV Junior antenna is mounted to a pole on his chimney and then spans his backyard to a post in the far corner of his property. The G5RV antenna allows him to operate on 40 meters through 10 meters with a LDG AT100 Pro auto tuner between his rig and the antenna. He is limited with trees on his property which limit his choices for HF antennas.

Joe has been active in leadership for the Fond du Lac Amateur Radio Club with serving one year as a Board of Director member and then he was elected club President in 2011. Joe is an ARRL member as well as an ARES member. He recently participated in the Race the Lake 90 mile bike race as an ARES communicator on August 21, 2022.



Joe's most memorable QSO was during a slack time at one of the Club Brat Fry's in Lomira where he got a chance to operate the HF radio in the Yellow Banana. He was able to have a QSO with a ham from Italy from the truck on 20 meters. Joe has checked into a number SSB HF net with the primary one being the YL international SSB net as well as the ECARS, North CARS and South CARS nets. He also has checked into the OMISS SSB net. Joe has participated in the Dayton Hamvention and met a number of YL International hams that get together at their convention. He said it is nice to put a face to the hams you meet on these nets. At the Dayton Hamvention, Joe also was able to get his picture taken with one of the astronauts on the ISS who has a ham license and got an autographed copy of the photo.

Joe also participates in the WI QSO Party every year as well as ARRL Field Day. Joe has confirmed 44 states out of the 50 states on the HF bands. Joe's ultimate goal in ham radio is fully retire and spend more time on the HF bands.



How To Operate a DMR Radio

At the October meeting, we will be starting something brand new! One of the most important things we can do as an organization is to educate the members about the many facets of Amateur Radio. And who better to teach than the long term, very experienced members of our own club! Ham Radio is experiencing a boom in new licensees, and it may be because of all the new and exciting facets of your hobby. One of these new avenues is DMR radio. Cully and Wally gave a great demonstration about a year ago as club entertainment. Now you will have the chance to visit with these 2 great hams before the meeting to get a one on one demonstration and get all of your questions answered!

DMR stands for Digital Mobile Radio and is an international standard that has been defined for two-way radios. The DMR standard allows equipment developed by different manufacturers to operate together on the same network for all the functions defined within the standard. The aim of the DMR standard was to create a digital radio system with low complexity and low cost that still allows for equipment from different manufacturers to work together, allowing users to shop around rather than being locked into a proprietary system which would be costly to replace and maintain.

I remember Cully firing up his DMR handheld at a meeting one year ago and called CQ. An operator from Sweden answered him and he held a conversation with the station also running DMR! I was simply stunned.

If you own a DMR radio, please bring it with you and bring your questions. If you don't own a radio, bring along a tablet and pen so you can take notes.






CLUB MINUTES FOR SEPT 2022

We began the meeting with a Skype video meeting with Steve Molo KI4KWR who is Brand Ambassador at Giga Parts in Huntsville, Alabama. Giga Parts started as computer store in 1998. In 2007 they had a small showroom and store. Now they have a 45,000 sq. foot warehouse and showroom with amateur radio products as well as computers, Steve said they make more on accessories then they do on transceivers. The average profit on transceiver is about 10%. They also have a small store in Las Vegas, NV as well.

On April 15, 2020 they had massive sales surge that wiped out most of their inventory. Steve figured that sales surge was due to the first stimulus checks. Equipment is still hard to get for them. If see an item in stock on their website don't wait to order it because they may not have any more for months. Their website is: www.gigaparts.com. They have partnered with the QRZ.com jump start program which gives newly licensed hams a free QRZ-1 HT along with the programming software for it. They took a TYT UV-88 HT and rewrote the manual and software to make the radio easy to program. For most radios he recommends using the RT systems software.

The club business meeting was called to order by President Dave McCumber N9WQ at 7:56 PM. We had introduction of all meeting attendees. A motion was made by Phil Schmahl W9PHL to approve the August meeting minutes and Lee Clausen KC9ZVZ seconded the motion. The motion to approve the minutes passed.

Doug Schultz N9EZF then gave the Treasurer's report. Cully Kowal KS0D made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report and Jack Heil KG9IN seconded the motion. The motion to approve the Treasurer's report passed. 
CLUB MINUTES FOR SEPTEMBER 2022 (CONTINUED)



Long time KFIZ Radio personality Joe Goeser has passed away on September 14, 2022 at the age of 97.



KFIZ's longest running employee, Joe Goeser started at the station right out of high school in 1944 at the age of 18. He would go on to work at the station for parts of six decades. In 9th grade, Goeser wrote in a paper that he wanted to work in radio and wanted to be "a big fish in a small pond". Joe's son Pete recalls Joe working different hours of the day and night. Pete recalled Joe going in at 4 AM to work the morning show, then cover a sporting event at night and not get home until 1AM and go back in at 4 or 5 AM the next day to do it all over again. Goeser developed and performed several characters over the years. The most famous being Josh Crunchmeyer. That show aired mid-days on Saturday and became so popular that people would schedule their lunch breaks around the show so they wouldn't miss it. Joe would receive offers to work at stations in bigger markets, but he never left his hometown of Fond du Lac. Pete said Joe passed right at 5:05 AM, just in time to start his morning show in Heaven. KFIZ wishes Joe's friends and family our thoughts and prayers during this time.


